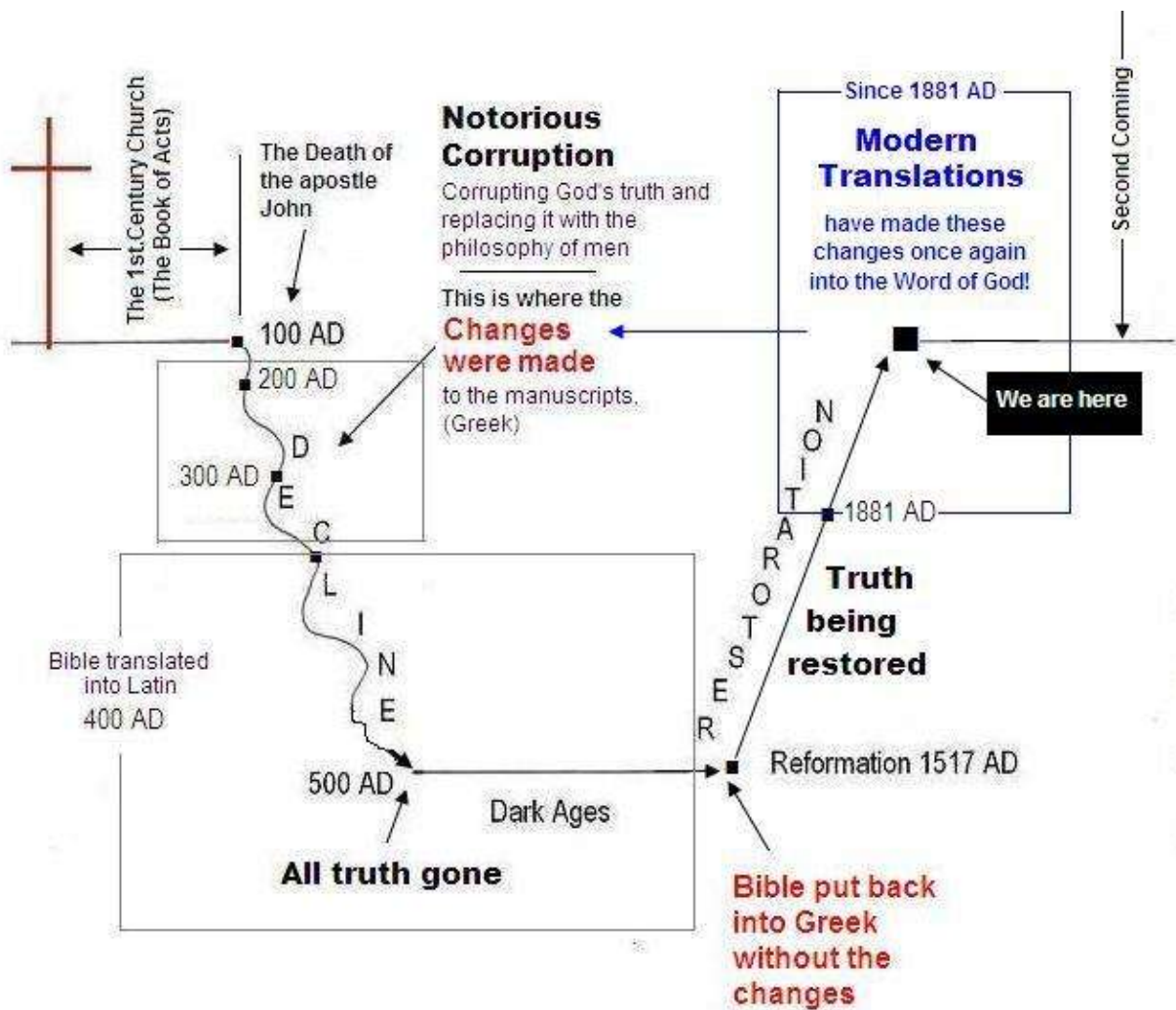


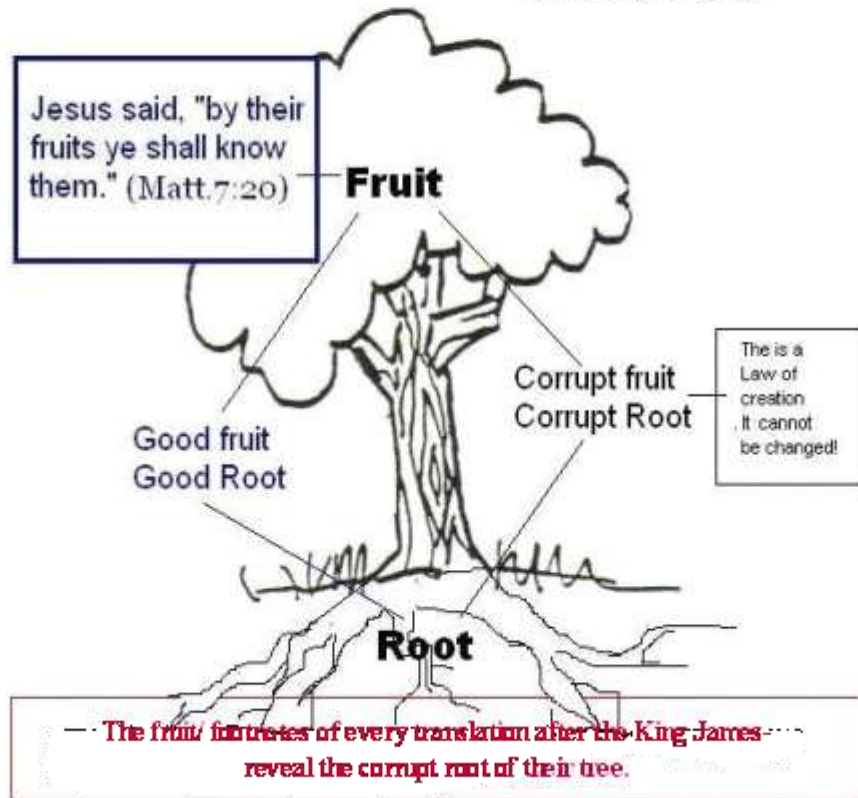
Simplifying The Issue Of The Greek Text

Look at the
Principle

"For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead."

Ye shall know them (which Bible) by their fruits"

The fruit confirms what the root of the issue is. Jesus said, "Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit. **A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit.**" (Matt 7:15-19) **The "fruit" cannot be denied!**

Here are some examples from modern translations

"Italics: Point out certain familiar passages now recognized as not adequately supported by the original manuscripts."

"Some early manuscripts do not have..."
(Corrupt fruit)

"The most reliable early manuscripts do not have..."
(Corrupt fruit)

"Not found in any Greek manuscript before the 16th. century..."
(Corrupt fruit)

The Fruit confirms the root is corrupt

This is NOT translation!

This is Changing God's Word!

Corrupt Root !

who is Sovereign and Providential, would inspire the "wisdom of man" to correct His Word? What did these modern translators find that the God of heaven and earth apparently missed?
